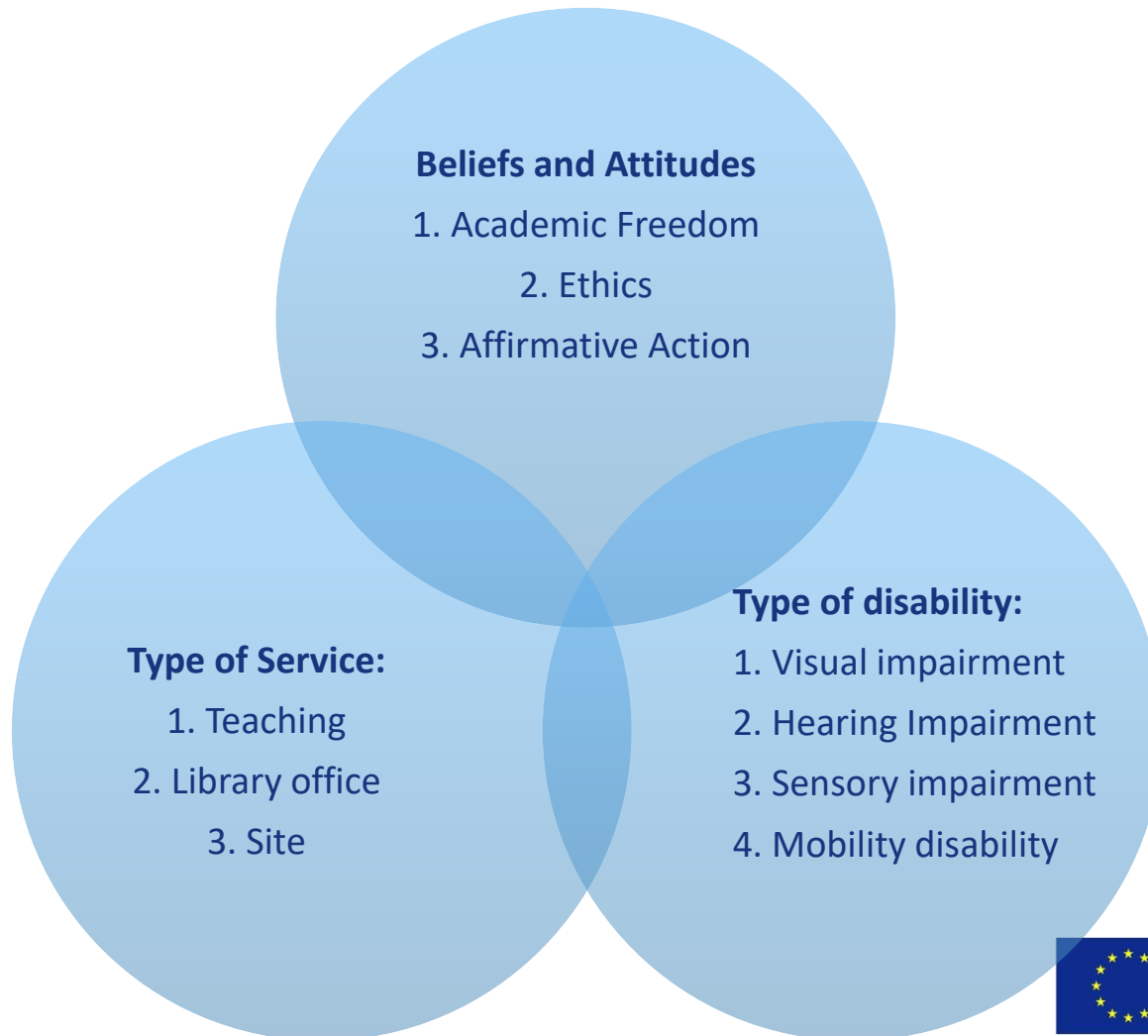
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Is There a dilemma?



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Choosing accessibility case study's



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Analysis steps in a case study (L. Shilo, 2004)



1. What are the **relevant facts** in this case?
2. What are the **emotions** that the case raises?
3. What are the **thoughts**?
4. What are the **values, beliefs and attitudes**?
5. Is there a **conflict** between the values?
6. Are the **issues** at the level of a **single student** ? Or an **academic institution**?
7. Who are the **key stakeholders**?
8. Suggest options for **solving the case**.



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Case study 1



- 100 students study the course "Calculus 1". The front row of the class is reserved for students with visual and auditory disabilities.
- One day the students without disabilities sat in the reserved seats. This led to a fight.
- The lecturer declared that they must solve their problems among themselves, his job is to teach.



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Case study 2



- A lecturer invested in a Presentation in terms of content and form.
- A student with a hearing impairment asked the lecturer to not to turn his back and not turn off the light when viewing the presentation.
- The lecturer refused on the grounds that if you do not turn off the lights students will not be able to read the text...In addition, noted that he can not concentrate when standing in one place



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Case study 3



- A student was regularly late for morning lessons.
- On the fourth time, the lecturer approached the student and told him that the course will not be recognized and he must register again.
- The student asked for a personal meeting with the lecturer and told him that he is dealing with post traumatic stress disorder so he can not get up in the morning.
- The lecturer was very surprised ...
